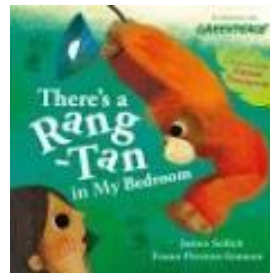


YEAR 1 NEWSLETTER

This half term our 'Talk Through Stories' texts will be '**Somebody Swallowed Stanley**' by Sarah Roberts and then we will be reading '**Rang-tan**' by James Sellick linked to our learning about our planet.



In English we will link our writing to the texts that we read in Phonics. We will be drawing together all the skills learnt this year and work on applying these independently. We will also continue to practice consistent letter sizes and the correct use of capital letters.

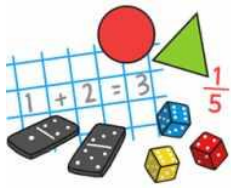


RE - Year 1 have been learning about generosity and to end the unit we would like to complete an act of generosity. Over half term we would love it if the children could check their toys and/or books for any that they no longer need and could be enjoyed by children less fortunate than them. Thank you for all of your support with spellings, these will continue fortnightly, with the spelling homework due in on a Friday - we are seeing many children using these in their writing which is fantastic! There will be an optional additional challenge task for children starting next half too, this is in preparation for the transition into Year 2.

In **Mathematics** we will be revisit our work on place value to 100, identifying tens and one and using this to compare numbers. We will also be learning about time, times of day and the position of the hands on the clock.

Curriculum

Year 1 will be covering the following subjects this half term.

Science	To conclude the year we will be focusing on 'working scientifically' and conduct experiments linked to our previous learning in Science including materials and ourselves.
History	In History we will be learning about castles, what a castle has and why they are important. We will visit Southsea Castle on Tuesday 16 th June (half day visit) and find out why it is an important landmark in our city. Any parent helpers who can drive to Southsea Castle with their child will be appreciated.
RE	Our focus in RE this half term is on the creation story and how different religions retell the story.
